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# Film restoration laboratory opens in Hong Kong

Italy's film restoration laboratory <u>L'Immagine Ritrovata</u> is set to open a new facility in Hong Kong, its first in Asia, for the restoration and conservation of Asian film heritage. <u>Bede CHENG</u> <u>鄭子宏</u> (pictured) will head the new office from April 11.

With an investment of €500,000 (US\$551,000), <u>L'Immagine Ritrovata Asia</u> will be equipped with state-of-the-art machinery for services such as film repair, washing and scanning.

"There's always a risk if you send a print overseas, plus the additional cost such as insurance. But now, scanning can be done in Hong Kong. The picture and the sound can be digitised locally; only the cleanup – the digital restoration work – is done in Italy," said L'Immagine Ritrovata's Bologna-based director <u>Davide POZZI</u> at <u>Hong Kong FilMart 香港國際影視展</u>.

Through a new partnership, L'Immagine Ritrovata Asia will undertake colour correction at One Cool Film Production Co Ltd 天下一電影製作有限公司's post production facilities. Both companies are located at Milkyway Image (HK) Ltd 銀河映像(香港)有限公司's studio in Kwun Tung.

Established in 1992, L'Immagine Ritrovata made its first Asian restoration in 2008 when the <u>Hong Kong Film Archive 香港電影資料館</u> sent in the lost Chinese classic <u>Confucius 孔夫子 (1938)</u>. Since then, the business for Asia has grown significantly.

Its Asian clients now include <u>Chinese Taipei Film Archive 國家電影資料館</u>, <u>Film Development Council of the Philippines (FDCP)</u>, National Museum of Singapore as well as Hong Kong companies such as Fortune Star Entertainment (HK) Ltd 星空傳媒發行製作有限公司, Orange

## Sky Golden Harvest Entertainment Co Ltd (OSGH) 橙天嘉禾娛樂 and We Distribution Ltd.

The restored films are usually premiered at key international festivals. Last year, <u>King HU 胡金銓</u> 's <u>Dragon Gate Inn</u> 龍門客棧 (1967) premiered in 4K at Cannes; <u>JIANG Wen 姜文</u>'s <u>In the Heat of the Sun 陽光燦爛的日子 (1995)</u> and <u>Peter CHAN 陳可辛</u>'s <u>Comrades, Almost a Love Story 甜</u>蜜蜜 (1996) both premiered at the Venice festival in 2013.

Newly restored films — which are expected to screen at major international film events in the coming year — include Hu's <u>A Touch of Zen 恢女 (1970)</u> and <u>John WOO 吳宇森</u>'s <u>A Better Tomorrow</u> 英雄本色 (1986).

Last year, L'Immagine Ritrovata received the prestigious Focal Award for the best archive restoration/preservation title for the restoration of Philippine director <u>Lino BROCKA</u>'s <u>Manila in the Claws of Neon Maynila... Sa mga kuko ng liwanag (1975)</u>, after already receiving the Focal Award for the preservation film laboratory of the year in 2013.

Cheng previously worked as programme assistant at the Hong Kong Film Archive (2000-2006) and as programme manager at the <u>Hong Kong International Film Festival 香港國際電影節</u> (2007-2013). Since Dec 2013, he has been Senior Program Manager at <u>The Metroplex 星影匯</u> cinema in Hong Kong; his last day there will be 10 Apr 2015.

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
